Scott is the founding principal of Equinox Investments, LLC, a real estate investment, development and management firm specializing in community planning, entitlements, and project development in the Northern Virginia area. A lifelong resident of the Commonwealth of Virginia, Plein began his career in 1976 when he founded <u>KT</u> <u>Enterprises, Inc., a</u> local landscape development firm. Today KT and its affiliate company, <u>Total Development Solutions</u>, provides turn-key site development solutions for some of the most prestigious home builders, developers, and commercial contractors in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.

An involved citizen in the community in which he lives, Scott recognizes the great responsibility of giving back and supports many non-profits and charitable groups through a devotion of financial resources, but more importantly-- time. He currently serves as the Chairman of the Northern Virginia Advisory Board for <u>Gleaning for the World</u>—a charitable organization that provides environmentally responsible humanitarian aid worldwide through the repurposing of usable products sourced from businesses and industry. He's the treasurer of <u>Potomac Riverkeeper</u> <u>Network</u>—the only nonprofit dedicated to protecting the entire Potomac Watershed through legal advocacy. He serves on the Board of Directors for Mason Housing Inc. And his mentorship of young leaders in commercial real estate is realized through his involvement with the <u>George Mason University School of Business</u>, of which Scott serves on the Advisory Board and Executive Committee, and <u>NAIOP Northern Virginia's Developing Leaders</u>. Scott also lends operational guidance and mentoring advocacy to Asian American and other minority students at <u>AASuccess</u> to advance the social, personal and professional fulfillment of our young citizens.

Scott previously served on several local and regional boards including the <u>Northern Virginia</u> <u>Transportation Alliance</u> and the <u>Northern Virginia Chapter of NAIOP</u>. He is a past president of the <u>Northern Virginia Building Industry Association</u>, as well as the <u>Dulles South Alliance</u>, an association of business and resident leaders dedicated to providing an open forum to the public on the future development opportunities in the Dulles South region. Scott also chaired the Building and Development Committee for Capital Caring's <u>'Adler Center for Caring'</u>, a state-of-the-art inpatient hospice and palliative care center.

Scott is devoted to the <u>White House Farm Foundation</u>, a nonprofit educational foundation that he established after his purchase of the 270 acre historic White House property in Luray, Virginia. Through the Foundation, he hopes to enrich individuals with the knowledge of and involvement in our natural ecological systems, sustainable agriculture, holistic community planning, conservation, and respect for local history and culture.

Scott's cornerstone project--the <u>Villages of Piedmont at Leopold's Preserve</u>—has been touted by Prince William County officials as "a model for preservation-oriented land planning". Uniquely situated at the mid-section of the Journey Through Hallowed Ground's National Scenic Byway in Haymarket, Virginia, this award-winning project exemplifies Scott's deep commitment to the environment and ecological systems, particularly as it pertains to finding a balance between human habitat needs and preserving our natural habitats. One of the most compelling aspects of the project is its impressive open-space commitment—the permanent conservation of 380 acres dedicated to the legacy of famous conservationist, Aldo Leopold. Today, the public amenity known as <u>Leopold's Preserve</u> is visited daily by community residents, tourists, and educational groups who enjoy its 7 miles of walking trails, interpretive signage, observation platforms and wildflower meadows that showcase the environmental and historic features of the property and surrounding area.
